Dolomites Bike Day Regulation

Some rules for a smooth and happy bike day

The Dolomites Bike Day is above all a bicycle festival, open to all cycling enthusiasts of all ages. However, to ensure a relaxed and joyful bike day, there are some important rules to follow.

1. What is the "Dolomites Bike Day"?

The Dolomites Bike Day is a **NON-competitive cycling event** open to everyone which takes place on roads closed to traffic, in compliance with the general traffic rules.

2. Road traffic regulations | Environment

The entire event takes place in accordance with the applicable road traffic regulations, in order to ensure the safety of all participants. All participants are also required to respect and protect the environment.

3. Road closure | Cycling direction

The roads are closed to motorized traffic **from 9,00 am to 3,00 pm**. The organizing committee, does not guarantee absolute absence of traffic on the route.

It is recommended to ride the selected route counterclockwise and stay on the right-hand side of the road.

4. Safety | Use of helmet

Bearing in mind that you will be riding on steep mountain pass roads and may reach high speeds, you should always keep to the right, use **only the right-hand lane**, and maintain a moderate speed when descending. Please also consider that families with children and less experienced cyclists will be sharing the roads during the Dolomites Bike Day. Therefore, ride with caution and show respect to all participants.

For safety reasons, **wearing a protective helmet is mandatory**.

5. Authorized vehicles

The only vehicles permitted to circulate on the closed roads during the traffic restriction are those of the public safety services (Carabinieri, police, ambulances, fire brigade, civil protection, and other vehicles with special authorization), all of which will be equipped with sirens and warning lights. Vehicles belonging to the organization are also allowed to operate within the closed area.

6. Starting times | Registration

Considering that the Dolomites Bike Day is not a race but a non-competitive event, there is no fixed start time. Participants may begin along the route whenever and wherever they wish.

Important: the event officially starts at 9:00 am Before this time, cars and motorcycles may still be present on the roads. The passes will reopen to motor traffic at 3:00 pm

The Dolomites Bike Day is a non-competitive cycling event, free of charge and open to all cycling enthusiasts. **No registration or cycling club membership is required.**

7. Public busses

On the occasion of the Dolomites Bike Day the bus service to the Dolomites passes Campolongo, Pordoi, Fedaia, Falzarego and Valparola will be suspended.

8. Responsibility

The organizing committee of the Dolomites Bike Day cannot be held responsible for any accidents, injuries, or damage to persons or property that may occur before, during, or after the event. Participation in the Dolomites Bike Day is at one's own risk. By taking part, participants waive any legal claims against third parties, the organizers, and all natural or legal persons involved in the organization of the event. All participants are required to comply with the applicable road traffic regulations.

9. Rescue Service | Technical service | Broom wagon

A first aid and rescue service is guaranteed along the entire route. Technical bike assistance is also available. Any technical services requested will be at the participants' expense.

At the end of the event, participants who are unable to complete the ascent of the passes will be assisted and transported back home.
